All Young AIM students are encouraged to perform and their participation must be endorsed by their instrumental teacher. These concerts are open to the public.

What do I do if I need an accompanist?

An accompanist is provided every Saturday for the 11am & 2pm concert. They are also available to rehearse between 10am and 11am each Saturday.

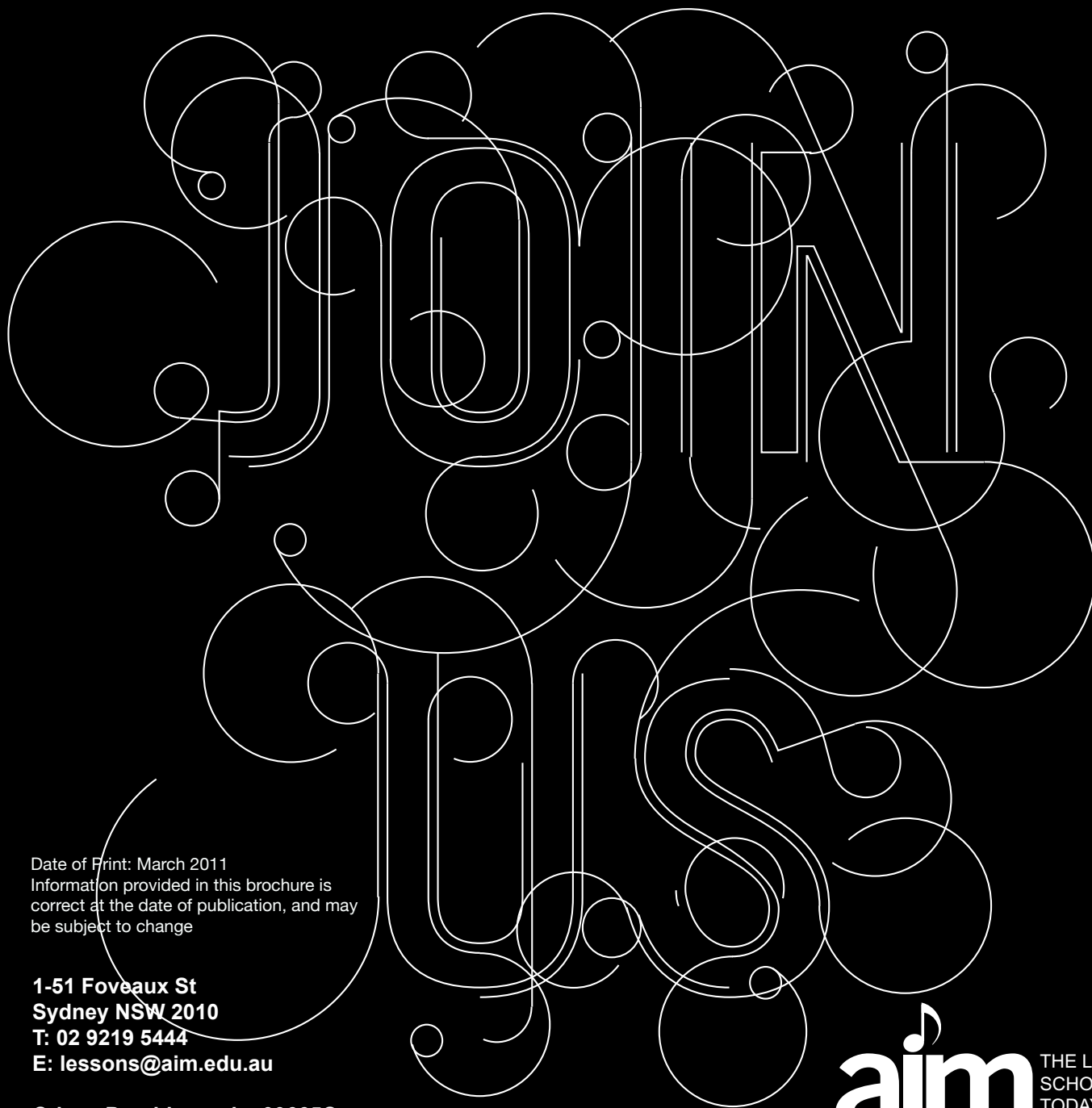
Will I receive feedback after my performance?
